## Holiday shuts post offices

The Farmington Post Office will operate on a holiday schedule during Memorial Day observance Monday, May 28.

Farmington Postmaster Kenneth B. Harris said there will be no regular morning or business mail deliveries, and usual post-office lobby services will not be available at either facility.

Delivery of certain expedited mail service will continue during the holiday weekend. Included are Special Delivery and Express Mail.

Mail pick up from collection boxes also will be on holiday schedule, as posted on individual boxes.

Normal mail service will resume Tuesday, May 29.

Health Care Cost Containment Committee, said the panel has spent most of the past year on two bills which he sponsored — H.R. 4736 and H.R. 5100.

The first establishes a statewide limit on hospital capital improvements and the second strengthens the process by which these improvements are approved by the state.

"One of the major reasons for seeking re-election is so I can work for the passage of these and other measures needed to deal with the frightening problem of soaring health-care costs," Brotherton said.

"They are growing at twice the rate of inflation and represent 23.7 percent of the total state budget and 40 percent of the Social Services budget."

Nearly one out of every four dollars spent by state government is for a health-related activity," he continued.

"Health-care costs siphon off taxpayers' dollars that are desperately needed elsewhere in areas like education and mental health. These costs are creating unacceptable burdens to the taxpayers and discouraging business expansion. We must bring them under control."

The 69th District lawmaker, a former mayor of Farmington, was first elected to the House in 1974. He is the vice chairman of the House Economic Development and Energy Committee and he also serves on the House Committees on Public Health, City Government and Urban Affairs.

"The support I have received throughout my years in office has been gratifying," he said. "I will continue to work for that support in the hope that voters will allow me the privilege of representing them for another two years."

Smokers who want to kick the habit will have their chance at a Five-Day Stop-Smoking Clinic directed by Arthur Weaver, professor of surgery at Wayne State University. The program will begin at 7:30 p.m. Monday, June 4 and run through Friday, June 8 at the Ten Mile Community School, 32789 W. 10 Mile.

The program is by donation only, with no preregistration necessary.

Dr. Weaver, a cancer surgeon who is well-known for his fight against tobacco and John Swanson, a health-education specialist, will lead the programs. Dr. Weaver's stop-smoking techniques have been popularized by television, radio and many newspaper articles.

He attributes the high success rate of these programs to the combined attack on both the physiological and psychological

aspects of the tobacco addiction.
