

UPHOLDING OAKLAND Circuit
Judge George LaPiata, the Supreme
Court ruled early last week that the
Michigan Legislature made an unconstitutional procedural step in 1983
when it redistricted itself.

The ruling reinstated the so-called

"Apol plan" used in the 1982 election.
The Apol plan contains larger popula-tion differences but created geographi-cally more compact districts than the legislature's plan. The ruling delighted most Republicans and dismayed many
