## Rider makes 'Grand' show

For many years, the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club (BOH) was just a part of the neighborhood for Katle Monahan, but for at least one night on

of the neighborhood for Katle Monahan, but for at least one night on Saturday, she owned it.

Monahan, 30, who grew up right next door to the BOH, won the Detroit Horse Show's main event, the \$30,000 Mercedes Benx North American Grand Priz Saturday night, despite having to compete in miserable conditions on a wet and muddy course.

Though she has been riding in BOH abows for 23 years and is considered one of the top riders in the United States, it was the first time she had ever won the big one in her own town.

"I was thrilled," said Monahan, who now lives and owns a borse farm in Middleburg, Va. "It was great to come. back it felt really good to win on the course where I started my riding career."

MONAHAN RODE Mrs. W. Averill Harriman's The Governor to victory, beating 35 other entries for the \$7,500 first prize and the Stewart Cram Memorial Trophy. She also finished fifth on The Natural, owned by Paul Imman of Farmington tillus. The filed featured six of the top 10 riders in the country. Peter Leone, ranked No. 4, came in second and the country's leading rider, Leslie Burr, finished third, Half of the borses entered turned in clean rides in the opening round of jumps, forcing a jump-off. Eight of the 18 finalists had faultless rides the second time around whomahan was declared the winner because her time of 29.4 was more than two seconds faster than her closest opponent.

The jump-oil was a good one," Monahan said. "It was a little slippery. I had to try to go fast and still have a clean ride."

THE JUMPER CIRCUIT's "Rider of the Year" in 1982, Monahan is vying for a berth on the U.S. Olympic Equestrian team. She has already won three events on the Grand Prix circuit this season, adding the Detroit Horne Show event to the ones she won previously in Ocala and West Palm Beach, Fis.

She will compete in the I Love New York abow in Lake Placid this week-end, the last show before the final selection is made.

"I think my chances are very good," she said. "I have two rides (Amadia and Norco) and they (Olympic committee) want to take one or two riders that have backup horses."

Whether she makes the Olympic team or not, Monahan is content just to be a part of the sport of equestrian.

"It's a great sport," she said. "I feel tucky to be doing what I fove to do most."
