Moves to produce more gamefish working at 2 Oakland County Jakes

Two Oakland County lakes — Wolve-ne and Orion — have been treated to move stunted panfish and restocked ith gamelish

with gamelish.

"While the impact of the treatment cannot be known until fall surveys are analyzed, the results are encouraging," said Ron Spitter, flasheries biologist for the state Department of Natural Re-

the state Department of Natural Resources.

DNR crews used Fintrol in a solution that selectively kills small fish but is harmless to larger fish, animals, birds and humans. Preliminary results:

• Wolverine — 98 percent of the dead fish were blougills and sunfish 5 inches or smaller, the rest were small perch, minnows, crapples and green suntiss. After treatment, 8,000 northern pike fingerlings (4 inches) were planted.

• Orion — 98 percent were bluggills.

• Orlon — 98 percent were bluegills and sunfish 5 inches or smaller, the rest were alsewives, green sunfish, rock bass and minnows. After treatment, 15,000 pike fingerlings were planted.

"In both lakes, there were virtually no largemouth bass or northern pike killed by the treatments." Spiller said. Volunteers helped clean up the dead fish which drifted ashore.
