## Women politicos needed at state level

FOR BETTER or worse, the National Organization for Women (NOW) has set its sights on a female vice presidential candidate. It's no longer a proposal. It is a demand on Democratic nominee Walter Mondale

dale.

It doesn't matter whether the VP candidate has good credentials or is honest. Just as long as it's a she.

NOW's thinking is on a par with Archie Bunker's, who in an argument with son-in-law Mike once explained his notion of ticket balancing: "See, you get a Jew as treasurer, and then you get an Ir-ishman as auditor to keep him honest."

Top contenders, according to the Top contenders, according to the national media, are a three-term congresswoman from New York and a mayor of a medium-sized California city. One wonders if they would be contenders if they would be centenders if they wore males—especially considering that the other party's probable vice presidential nomince has been in military co.nbat, president of a company, a congressman, envoy to China, head of the CIA, national party chairman and a presidential contender in his own right. "A WOMAN vice president wouldn't be such an issue today," writes my colleague, Sandra Arm-bruster, "had more women been elected to serve at local levels of government." She's right, of course.

course. Indeed, one could go a step further and argue that there is a serious need for greater female input in state government.

The Michigan Legislature has two females in the upper house which has 38 members, and 14 females in the lower house of 110 members. Nationally, of 1,986 state senators, there are only 177 women; of 5,452 house members, only 816 women. That's in the 15-percent ballpark.

Look at what a legislature does:

Half the budget is social services. To America's credit, the percentage of elderly who are below the poverty level is declining, but the percentage of single parents (mainly mothers) below that level is rising. Poverty is becoming an issue of greater and greater concern to women.

Another quarter of the budget is education. Half or more of the kids

When legislative candidates, par-ticularly in Oakland County, start blowing smoke about mass transit, note the harder line taken by male candidates compared to female candidates. There's a genuine dif-ference between the sexes on this issue, and do you know what? The females are right, Worker safety laws for intra-state industries, which tend to be smaller and have greater concen-trations of female employees. Health insurance regulations. Sex-ual harassment laws.

ONE OCCUPANT of the vice presidency described it as "not worth a bucket of warm spit." Actually, a reporter changed the final word so it could be printed in a

family journal.

More than a female vice president, America needs at least a doubling or tripling of female state legislators.

Footnote: Some business types in Michigan have been pushing a con-stitutional amendment for a part-time legislature (PPT) time legislature (PTL). They figure it would hold down spending and attract a more public-service ori-ented and less career-oriented kind of politician.

Certainly, the kinds of occupations represented in the Michigan-Legislature would change if the job-became part-time. Query: Would a part-time legislature attract more female candidates? It's worth thinking about.
