U.S. Air Force Needs Nurses

Sgt. W.R. Williams, local Air Force representative, has announced that there is a critical shortage of registered nurses in the Air Force and that the Air Force is offering direct offer appointments to qualified nurse applicants.

"To qualify," he said, "one must be a registered nurse, between 20-35 years old, and have no dependent children under 18 years old." He pointed out the initial tour of duty is two years with the opportunity to extend for additional periods of time or for career purposes.

Sgt. Williams added that Air Force nurses have the same functions and responsibilities as nurses in civilian hospitals, with the major difference being they are also Air Force Officers. They often assist in the evacuation of patients by air, and assist in the United States space program.
