Close of regular trout season in all inland waters.

SEPT. 9
Start of special extended season on rainbow and brown trout and coho and chinook salmon in Great Lakes, connecting waters, and designated inland waters.

OCT. 15
Spearing season begins on ciscoes, whitefish, carp, and suckers in designated waters.

NOV. 1
Spearing season on ciscoes, whitefish, carp, and suckers extended to other special waters.

NOV. 30
Close of special extended season on rainbow and brown trout and coho and chinook salmon in designated inland streams. Same season continues on Great Lakes, connecting waters, and designated inland lakes.

DEC. 31

Campus Adopts Iranian Village

Relief is on the way to thousands of Iranians who were left homeless in the wake of the recent earthquake in Khon-
asan, a northeastern province. The Iranian Earthquake Relief Committee, under the University of Michigan Campus Ecumenical Council, has set a goal of \$50,000 for the proposed rebuilding of an entire village.

The village, to be named Michigan, would have earthquake-proof construction. Since some areas were almost totally destroyed, the Iranian government has ordered tanks to cut down the chance of epidemics.

Open water ditches and underground tunnels supply most of the water to Iranians. Officials are concerned that epidemics may occur.

The drive, which is being coordinated by Dr. Jamal Asgari and Iraj Mahdavi, of Ann Arbor, originally began as a temporary relief fund in Ann Arbor, but has since spread throughout the state.

Priorities Listed By County

A sub-committee of the Oakland County Commission on Economic Opportunity (OCCOE) is currently formulating the group's 1969 program from information gleaned from 39 public hearings held last month.

Priorities programs will be job training, housing for low-income residents, senior citizens needs and transportation needs, school related problems and the need for increased day care facilities.

Goals on the various projects will be:
Job opportunities -- The OCCOE will continue to work with private employers through the National Alliance of Businessmen.

Housing for low-income residents -- A housing specialist will be employed to work specifically on the research and development of housing programs. These programs might include self-help construction, renovation of existing housing and contractual building.

School related problems -- Study will be made of fees for school and school recreational activities, student employment, planning for recreational programs geared to the needs of disadvantaged youth.

The OCCOE 1969 program will also include efforts to assist senior citizens in part-time employment, implementation of 10-hour child-care facilities and study of the problems of transportation for needy residents to places of employment, health services and social agencies.

Still Have Chance To Register

Registrations are still being accepted in the Farmington school administration building, 35500 Shawansee, for adult education classes not yet filled. Classes will begin Sept. 23.

Again this year, prospective pilots may enroll for instruction in instrument ground school or ground school for private pilot rating. The pilot rating course includes preparation for the Federal written examination given to private pilots.

There are also class openings in business English, stenography, French I, cake decorating and stock market.

Adult driver education is offered, consisting of five two-hour classroom sessions and six hours behind the wheel of a dual-control car.

This term, American history, Latin and square dancing classes all meet in East Junior High.

Upholstery will be taught on Monday evenings in Farmington High School.

A beginner's class in acrylic painting will be held in East Junior High on Mondays and more artists are invited to join the water color classes or advanced drawing and sketching groups.

Yoga classes have been transferred to Power Junior High this year and guitar and volleyball to Farmington High School.
