

# Health Aid For All Asked By O'Neill

H. Patrick O'Neill, candidate for the Democratic nomination for the 19th District Congressional seat, wants to see a national program of health care and believes that stepped-up model cities programs, aid to law enforcement and flood relief are needed by the district.

O'Neill told a gathering at the home of Patrick Tավաճեցի, 3176 Haldane, Livonia, that "military adventuring" in Indo-China puts the spending of tax dollars "seriously asked."

He said he would work to

"see that Congress re-asserts itself as the final authority" on committing army forces to "military forays in foreign nations."

He said, "A military budget clothed in secrecy takes far too many of our tax dollars that could much better be spent for education, for improved health care, for controlling our environment, for assisting those who are unable to make their way in our society and for enabling all of us to live better and in better harmony."

# S'craft Bargainers Submit To Mediation

Unresolved on several items, faculty contract negotiations at Schoolcraft Community College are being submitted to a state labor mediator by joint agreement of the bargainers.

Beginning of mediated sessions is slated for Aug. 3. Fair-

session classes are scheduled to begin in early September. Both teachers have voted unanimously in an advisory action to withhold services unless a new contract is ratified by then.

"Although such an advisory vote doesn't constitute official determination to strike, it has placed the 115 Faculty Forum members of the 156-person staff on record as adamant,

for a period when the college's chief bargainer, Kenneth Lindner, vice president for business, was hospitalized.

Faculty Forum bargaining team chairman Oscar Poupart only recently said he was expecting early final agreement due to accelerated bargaining sessions, that became 13-hour

marathons the first half of July.

Poupart's assistant chairman, Larry VanderMolen, said upon announcing mediation, "We expect that progress will continue at that time, and we'll escalate."

Lindner declined to make a statement until after the college trustees meet tonight (Wednesday), other than to confirm that mediation was agreed upon by both sides.

"I BELIEVE a greater proportion of the tax dollars expended by citizens in the 19th Congressional District should return to them in the form of benefits. I believe that being of assistance to the mayor of the City of Livonia has given me special insights in the way communities function and into the wants and needs of people who live in the 19th Congressional District," he said.

"I believe that people would appreciate being represented by someone who was, until very recently, in exactly the circumstances of most of the people in the district.

"I have been active in citizens' groups seeking better education and a more direct representation in city hall. As an appointed city official, I am intimately familiar with the problems of running a city.

"I am aware that the largest percentage of the tax dollar goes to provide education and that very few tax dollars are left over to provide for the public safety and to provide other city services such as the removal of wastes and the protection of the environment that citizens are beginning to demand.

THE CURRENT contract expired June 30. Summer school instructors are set under an agreement that will guarantee them retroactive benefits of a new contract.

Issues causing an impasse include an administration plan to substitute administration-level divisional chairmen in place of current faculty-level area chairmen for each of six departments.

Others are: hours, load, salaries, the academic freedom posture, civil rights and length of contract.

"RATHER THAN going to Washington to be a national and international statesman, I believe that I ought to go to Washington to represent the people of the 19th District and to do what is in their best interest. I think many representatives in Congress forget that the House of Representatives was designed to give their constituents very direct representation in the Congress.
