

Law Professor Urges Citizen Participation In Pollution Control

ANN ARBOR University of Michigan law Prof. Joseph L. Sax, the leading expert on environmental law, urged Congress to recognize the citizen's right to protect the environment against pollution.

In his testimony before the Senate Subcommittee on Energy, Environment and Natural Resources recently, Prof. Sax argued for permitting citizens "to obtain judicial scrutiny of private or public conduct which may have unreasonable adverse impact on the environment."

This, the U-M professor said, is the key feature of the Environmental Protection Act of 1970, recently introduced by Sens. Philip Hart and George McGovern. The senate bill (S. 3575) has been adapted from a bill now before the Michigan legislature. Both bills were drafted by Prof. Sax.

IN HIS TESTIMONY, Sax addressed himself to some of the most commonly asked questions about the proposed bill. With so many existing laws for environmental protection, is another bill necessary? The environmental provisions in existing legislation are essentially "directions" to federal agencies, Sax said. But these directions, too often, are not reflected in the daily activities of government agencies, Sax maintained.

"Someone has to keep an eye on those who administer our precious resources." One of the best devices is the "watchfulness of the citizen, for it is he, in his own community, who will be victimized if adequate precautions are not taken," Sax said.

Will judicial intervention have the effect of usurping congressional decisions?

"The answer is decidedly not," indeed, the principal purpose of the proposed legislation is to make available in which to assure that settled congressional policies are implemented, and not obscured or quietly ignored by the actions of public or private enterprises," Sax said.

Are courts competent to examine the technical disputes in environmental situations?

"I must say bluntly that this question is just a red herring," Sax declared. "The job of courts is to hear and evaluate the testimony of those who are technical experts, not to do their job for them."

Will the proposed bill obstruct the work of regulatory agencies?

This fear is unwarranted. The bill explicitly notes that it is supplementary to the administrative process, and authorizes judicial remedy to administrative proceedings where they are available," Sax explained.

Tuition, Board Up At EMU

YPSILANTI Facing predictions of rising costs straight down the line, the Board of Regents of Eastern Michigan University have approved increases in tuition and room and board for the academic year of 1970-71.

The increase which would affect the vast majority of the students was the smallest. Under the new schedule, full-time undergraduates classified as residents of Michigan will pay \$6 more per 12 credit hours.

Formerly, these students paid \$18 per credit hour for a maximum of 12 hours, \$204. There will also be a charge of \$3 per credit hour for all hours in excess of 15.

FULL-TIME graduate students will pay \$22 a semester as compared with \$210 last year. Tuition remains at \$21 per credit hour but the charge will be for a maximum of 12 hours instead of 10 as before.

Rates for non-residents of Michigan will remain at 2.5 times that paid by residents.

Room and board in residence halls goes from \$95 to \$1,060 a year, an increase of \$65. Any student housed in an "over-loaded" room or suite, however, will be credited at the rate of \$1 a week. He will lose this credit if he declines to move when offered quarters which are not "overloaded."

The Regents were given this breakdown of anticipated cost increases in the residence halls: salaries and wages \$164,000, food \$135,000, cost of room credit for anticipated overload \$35,000 and other expense \$25,000. The total increase is \$359,000.

The average expected occupancy of the halls is 5,539 students.
