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First Festival Road Rally Set

A sports car road rally in conjunction with the Farmington Founder's Festival has been scheduled by the Michigan Rally Productions Group for Saturday, July 25, at 12:30 p.m.

The first car out will leave from Town and Country Dodge at 3015 Grand River at exactly 12:31. Entry fee is \$3 for advance registration or \$3.50 at the starting gate.

Cochairman Bob Healy and Charlie Kull explained that in this case, the sports car rally doesn't really require use of a sports car. Any auto with a speedometer and odometer, along with a licensed driver, act as navigator is all that it will take. The entrants will leave the starting point at 60-second intervals.

The navigator digests the rally route, a true track which are given each entrant one minute before he is scheduled to start and food directions to the driver. These instructions include information about where to go to remain on the course to avoid becoming lost along with accurate data on how fast to travel to stay on time. Check point crews will be stationed along the route at secret locations to grade the contestants.

Since the starting time of each entrant, along with the average speeds of the route and the distances traveled, are known, by the judges, it is a relatively simple mathematical procedure to determine which crew stays closest to the required time and becomes the winner.

It should be noted that rallies are not races. Speeds are below posted limits and speeding violations automatically disqualify any entrant. Trophies will be awarded the winners.

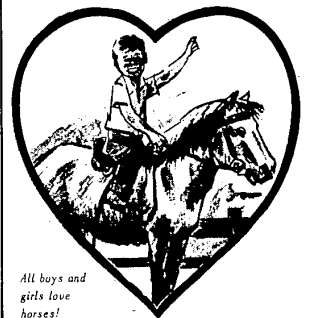
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
