Display Michigan Art

FARMINGTON — An exhibit of more than 200 paintings and photographs capturing the spirit, beauty, and mystique of Michigan has been scheduled for the Farmington Founders Festival.

Finding a suitable location for the exhibit was a problem until Carl Pursell, a candidate for the 14th District State Senate, volunteered the first floor of his headquarters office located at the corner of Farmington Road and Grand River.

All paintings and photographs were done by Michigan students and graduates of the Famous Artists and Farmers Photographers School of Westport, Connecticut. The exhibit has just completed showings at J. L. Hudson's Westland and Northland Shopping Centers. Adding local flavor are four pieces by two local artists, Martin A. Booth and David Babolt.

Twenty of the more outstanding "Discover Michigan" pieces were noted in the Congressional Record following display in the Washington office of Sen. Robert Griffin.
