Having Burroughs Corp. CEO W. Michael Blumenthal in the Michigan delegation helped the state's image. Blanchard said.

Asked about the impact of Consumers Power Co.'s, decision to abandon is 44 billion investment in the Midland nuclear plant, Blanchard said the subject was not brought up. In general, Blanchard said, the executives got a more positive story than they expected to hear.


