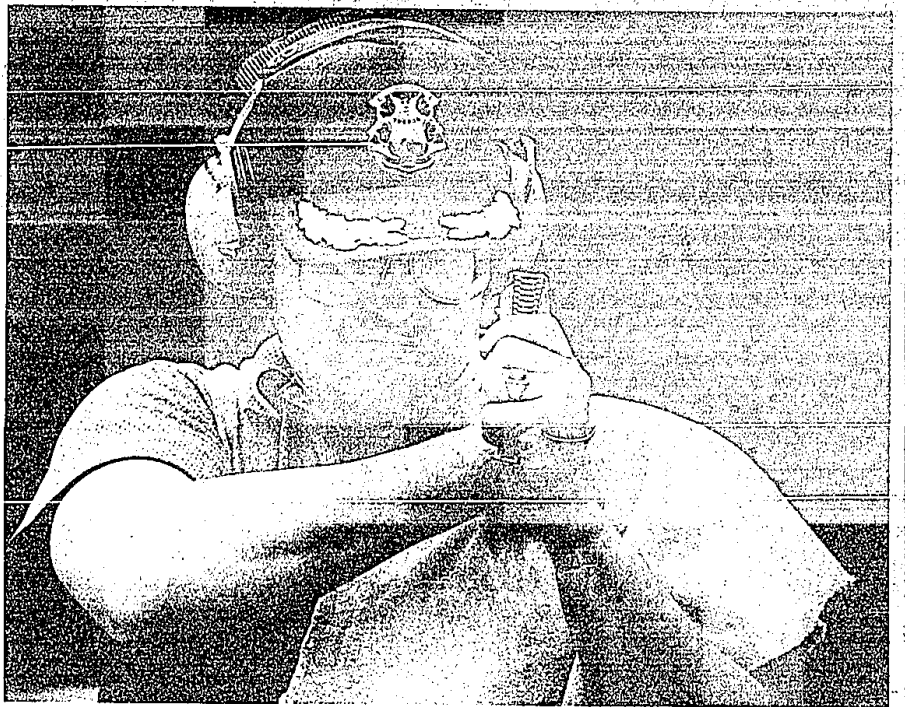


Faces flash for festival fun 'n' games

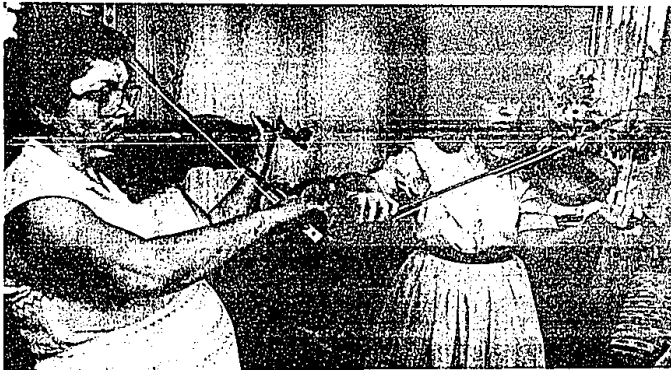


Miss Farmington, Mary Christine Porter, admires a target silhouette that was used for the firearms demonstration. First runner up, Pam McCann, is seated to her left.
