crop of young birds has begun to flock together aiready. Along with the adults, young birds are getting ready to fif south for the winter.

Migration to southern climes is no annual event that has been continuing for thousands of years. Most of air summer realtents outly come north to next and seyoung. Once that is complete, they fif to Florida, Loudsiana, or even South America.

Birds from northern Canada will join our Michigan migrants as they start their long southern journey. Many song birds — warhiers, sparrows, thruther and blackbirds — will follow landmarks such as the Great Lakes, using them like we use a read map.

SEVERAL PLACES along the way serve as gathering places where the birds congregate before proceeding. Pt. Pelce in southern Ontain is one.

A large variety of birds will concentrate at the point waiting for suitable weather in which to cross Lake Eric.

At this large marsh near the Waterloo Recreation Area, anothill cranes, who feed in the surrounding farmlands, begin to fly into the marsh just before sunset.

sandhill cranes in October is the Audubon Society's Haehnie Sanctuary west of Ann Arbor in the Waterloo State Recreation Area.

Sandhill cranes stand five feet tall and have a wingspan of more than six feet. They fly with their necks extended straight forward (herons, egrets, and bitterns fly with their neck in an "5" shape) in large line formations.

THE ONLY observation point of the sanctuary is strategically located on a hill, so you can see the birds as they land in the depressed marsh to the

birds as uny mass an exerage day in October, the birds begin arriving in flocis of five to 150. They approach the marsh from all directions — some will even fly directly overhead.

Often times though, you will bear the resonant chortle call of the birds as they communicate with each other before you see them.

ALTHOUGH THE birds are large and you can see them very easily with the naked eye, bring a pair of binoculars so you can see some of the other species of wildlife in the marsh. Several species of ducks and geese can be seen feeding in the open marsh water. White-tailed deer are often seen on the edges of the marsh, too.

As suncet approaches, the number of birds entering the marsh dwindles to just a few. But during the past couple of hours, as many as 600 birds may have entered the marsh for a good night's rest. This same event happens each day in October, but when November's cold temperatures arrive, the sandhill cranes will condluse their migration to the southern states.


