Aerobics go high-tech

Franklin Racquet Club and Spa has opened an electronically equipped audio-video aerobics studio in the club at 23550 Northwestern Highway. The 2,400-square-foot studio is decorated with bright, multi-colored carpeting, mirrored walls, glass doors and has action-oriented life-sized figures on the walls. It is equipped with the newest of technological innovations in video stereo systems which make it the first of its kind in the world. In the front of the room is a deep stage for the instructor. On and around

the stage are custom-built cabinets and shelves which house the audio and video equipment, programmable and compatible turntable and cassette deck, portable Beta hi-fi video recorder for tapes, symmetrical speakers which send acoustically superior sound to every section of the room.

From the back of the studio, a video camera transmits shots of the instructor to two color monitors mounted on each side of the stage. The monitors offer optimum viewing to even those per-

sons located toward the back of the studio. Established in 1969 as an eight court tennis facility, the complex now covers more than one-quarter million square feet and houses 20 tennis courts, 20 racquetball courts and five outdoor clay courts. The club also has locker rooms with saunas, steam baths, whirlpools, massage rooms, a nursery, pro shop, beauty salon, restaurant, backgammon and card room. The next addition planned is a cocktail lounge.
