

# Redford, Livonia Battle To Wire In 'A' Loop

Redford Township's Class A baseball team—better known as Wonderland Lanes— isn't getting a chance to take it easy in the race for second round honors in the Greater Livonia League.

Despite a 7-1 record, Wonderland still is being pushed down to the final wire by nearby Livonia Hubert Realty.

Both teams added to their winning ways Wednesday when Wonderland squeaked past ITM, 7-6, while Hubert

upped its record to 9-3 by downing Garden City, 9-3.

Five games remain on the regular Class A schedule before the teams drop the curtain on Aug. 4 and the playoffs between the round winners begin.


ITM took the first round and already has a spot in the playoffs.

### Mich. Motorboats Increase

There are about 400,000 registered motorboats in Michigan, but the prediction of the first 500,000 registration cycle appears to be close to reality.

Secretary of State James M. Hare disclosed that as of June 30 his department had registered more than 380,000 motorboats and that the 400,000 mark will be realized before the end of July.

The current three-year registration is in its second year. Hare said. Motorboats may be registered at any branch office of the Secretary of State. Registration fee, good through 1971, is \$5.

Top previous totals were 437,000 at the close of the last registration period in 1968. Hare said that that number could well be exceeded during the current boating year.
