Peggs Of Redford Mark 50 Years

His proudest accomplishment, as he thinks back, is helping coin the slogan "City of Champions" for Detroit in 1927 and working on arrangements for the many festivities for sports heroes of that day.

A marriage that has spanned half a century, most of that time in Redford Township, is the occasion for celebration Sunday, July 26, by the family of Mr. and Mrs. James G. Peggs.

Jim Peggs, highly-regarded by celebrity and working newspaperman alike through its 40-plus years with Western Union Telegraph Co., will take his wife, Laura, to St. Agatha Catholic Church on that date to renew the vows they first spoke in 1920 in Holy Redeemer Church in Detroit.

Then, from 3 to 5 p.m., they'll be guests of honor at a reception to be hosted by the son and two daughters who grew up and still live in Redford Township, where the Peggs have made their home for 47 years at 19184 Gaylord.

SCENE of the reception will be the Dula Party Room, 28847 Grand River, and it may well draw many civic leaders in the metropolitan Detroit area as well as those connected with the news industry.

"The kids are planning everything about the party," Peggs said. "We're just supposed to be there."

"We really don't know what's going to happen," his wife added.

And if Mrs. Norma Hunschmidt, Mrs. Bernice Semik and Victor F. Peggs succeed in pulling a few surprises in the golden wedding party, it will be a new experience for their father, whose job before his 1965 retirement involved keeping a finger in just about every big happening at the Detroit scene.

PEGGS, who began newspaper work at the age of 12 as a printer's devil on a Kansas weekly owned by her uncle, worked for the Detroit News before joining Western Union in 1924.

"At that time," he pointed out, "there were no facilities for much telephone coverage, so 95 per cent of the news coverage in and out of Detroit was by telegraph."

It was Peggs' job to have adequate telegraph facilities available at all major events—big sporting events, political conventions, murder trials and introductions of new automobile models.

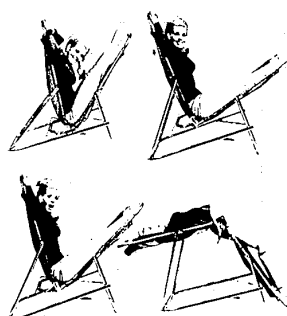

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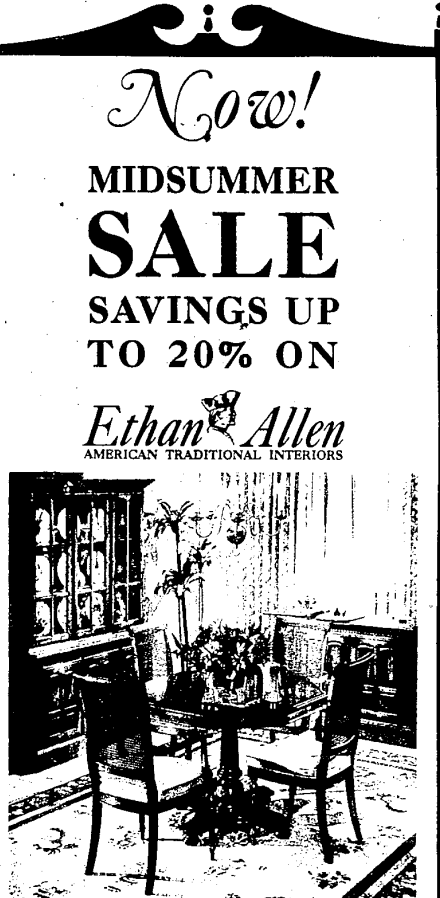
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
