price promotion rather than the two-for-ones.

"We don't give two drinks," said manager Diane Debold. "A lot of people come in and don't want those two drinks."

Like Dennison's and Olmopella's, McFrocks also offers reduced prices on drinks during their cocktail hour (4-7 p.m.).

The Ground Round, on the other hand, offers two-for-one drink specials. "We used to have quite extensive two-for-one's but we cut it back voluntarily," said manager Bill Roush, who

said he hasn't seen any decrease in business because of cutting back.

But Roush says he doesn't believe patrons become more intoxicated when served two drinks for the price of one. When someone intends to get intoxicated, they will, regardless of whether a bar has a price promotion or not, Roush said.

As far as the proposed rule change though, Roush says he is "rather neutral."

"We don't expect much reaction," he said, referring to his patrons.

Similarly, Brown says that so far he has "had no negative response from our licensees." If the LCC adopts the

proposal as a rule change, it will be subject to a public hearing. The same type of penalties now prescribed for violating any of the LCC's other rules and regulations.

Before making a decision, the LCC has scheduled a public hearing for Sept. 11 at its Lincoln Park office.

al to these rules. A copy of the proposed changes would be submitted to the joint legislative rules committee for study and final approval.

"This is a public hearing rule that has the effect of law," Brown said.

Proper Foot Wear

PROPER FOOT WEAR

The typical woman's dress often incorporates heels of the undesirable feature possible in footwear. The high heel causes 25% of the body's weight to fall onto a narrow area on the ball of the foot and the metatarsal head. The resulting force gives an opposing strain to the leg, but places an undue strain on the mid foot. The narrowed top of the shoe, straddling to a point, cramps the toes in a way ideal for developing bunions.

The best shoe, for men and women, has a heel and sole at least one inch thick. Having a cushioned arch from back to front of the shoe is best, so doing so provides the foot the maximum area on which to land and then strike the next step. The toe part of the shoe should be wide and placed in order to permit the foot to spread easily. Rubber, bushings, and wedges are examples of shoes that meet these principles.

If you have no back, ankle or foot pain, you may not recognize this problem's advice. However, if you have a problem in any of these areas, it is best to be informed to make proper shoe choice to prevent the development of bunions.
