## North kickers stun Bentley

North Farmington's surprising 2-1 upset of soccer powerhouse Livonia Bentley Thursday was just a matter of everything coming together.

"Oh my gosh, the guys are on cloud nine right now," said North coach Cathy Cole. "They went out today with the attitude of beating the world's greatest team. And they did."

"Now they know they can play." The contest, played in the rain at North, featured good offense in the first half and stingy defense in the second. The Raiders scored twice before Bentley could retaliate.

Karlson Felten got the first North goal on a breakaway. Jeff Keller converted a Paul Najjar pass for the Raiders' second score.

Torin Gniwewick nailed a penalty kick with 10 minutes left in the opening half to pull the Bulldogs to within one.

But the defenses dominated the second half. North goalie Dennis McCarthy turned away 20 Bentley shots in preserving the victory, while Craig Burland "put everything together at midfield," according to Cole. "He did an outstanding job."

The victory raised North's record to 2-3, while Bentley dipped to 2-1-1.

**STEVENSON 9, FARMINGTON 0:** John Gelmini put on a one-man offensive show for the home crowd Wednesday, pumping in five goals to lead Livonia Stevenson past Farmington.

The unbeaten (5-0) Spartans had little trouble with the Falcons. They led 5-0 at the half and alternated three goalies during the contest.

Dave Wiegert, Ray Barnes, Karl Bach and Chris Gembs joined Gelmini in the scoring column. Gembs also earned two assists. On defense, Steve Karla was "like a brick wall," according to Stevenson coach Pete Scerri. "He's just very cool. He has good timing. Everything is falling into place." Gelmini's scoring spree topped his total to 12 goals this season.

**CATH. CENTRAL 5, EISEL FORD 1:** Scoring machine Andy Rama increased his goals scored total to 25 by getting three in Redford Catholic Central's win over Dearborn Eisel Ford Thursday at Bell Creek Park.

Rama and C.J. Wendt each got goals in

the opening half on assists from John Hehm. Rama scored twice in the second half, once on a penalty kick, the other on an assist from Jeff Kuzma. Vitas Rogutius also netted a goal, with Chris Tykocik assisting.

Wendt picked up the assist, angling a pass to Cotter from the left side. Stocker was called on to make just one save in the shut-out.

Both the Harrison boys and girls are now 2-3 on the season.
