# Communicators meet at Botsford

"Breaking the Sound Barrier: Women in Detroit Radio" features three women whose voices are familiar to local listeners in a panel discussion Tuesday at the Botsford Inn in Farmington Hills.

The occasion is the September meeting of the Detroit Chapter of Women in Communications, Inc.

The women are Sue Carter, WWJ-AM mid-day co-anchor; Cynthia Canly, WNIC-FM afternoon anchor, and Kim Carson, WDRQ-FM night disc jockey. They will talk about their experiences starting out in radio broadcasting and breaking into the Detroit market.

David Newman, for nine years talk-show host on WXYZ-AM who begins at 7:30-AM Oct. 1 as host of a new talk show, will moderate the panel.

Carter, born in Columbus, Ohio, went to high school in Niles in southwestern Michigan and graduated from Michi-

gan State University. As a student in East Lansing, she worked part time for WVIC radio.

Carter moved to Detroit in 1975 and worked evenings as reporter-anchor on WXYZ. In 12 years in broadcasting, Carter said she has worked at eight or nine radio stations, including WWJ, WHND and as news director at the former WABX.

Canly started at WNIC in 1979 on the St. James and Harper Show, her first full-time radio job. A graduate of the University of Detroit, Canly began her career as a public relations-health education specialist for the American Cancer Society.

At the same time, she volunteered at WDET, Detroit's public radio station, doing readings for the blind on its sub-channel. Her entry into commercial radio occurred when a colleague at the cancer society moved to WNIC. Already having her feet wet in radio, Canly soon followed.

Carson, a Detroit native and graduate of DeWitt High School, broke into radio in 1977 in Knoxville, Tenn. Carson came to Detroit's WDRQ six years ago from WROR in Rockford, Ill., the oldest radio station at that state.
