Linowitz To Speak At U-M Exercises

ANN ARBOR Sol M. Linowitz, noted lawyer and former U.S. ambassador to the Organization of American States, will be the commencement speaker at the University of Michigan's summer graduation ceremonies on Aug. 9. Linowitz, who is a senior partner in Coudert Brothers law firm of Washington, D.C., and New York City, will speak on "Reflections on a Troubled Society." An estimated 2,500 students will receive degrees during ceremonies beginning at 1:45 p.m. in Hill Auditorium. A member of the board of directors of Time Inc., Linowitz served as U.S. ambassador to OAS from 1966 to 1969. During the same period he was the American representative to the Inter-American Committee of the Alliance for Progress. Recipient of honorary degrees from 17 colleges and

universities, Linowitz is chairman of the American Council on Education's special committee on campus tensions. He also is a trustee of 10 educational institutions and organizations.

He is vice chairman of the board of John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and chairman of the National Council of the Foreign Policy Association.

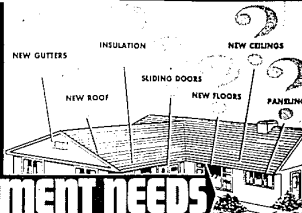
