City Continues Sign War

FARMINGTON

The Farmington City Council is continuing to strictly enforce the city's sign ordinance, especially the provision which limits free-standing signs to one per commercial site.

At its last meeting, the council received three requests from gas stations asking waiver of the sign ordinance to permit a second free-standing sign.

THE COUNCIL denied two

requests and tabled the third for further study.

Bruce Strange was denied a second sign for his station at 32340 Grand River. Also denied was the new Boron Station at Grand River and Drake.

The Boron station had already been denied permission for two pole signs but was asking approval to place a ground sign advertising Top Value trading stamps.

Tabled was a request from

Cecil Beebe to keep a ground sign at 31337 Grand River.

Beebe's request differed from the other two because it is a permanent sign (anchored into the cement) and has been on the site since 1964, before the sign ordinance was enacted.

The city has ruled that any permanent signs located on a site before the ordinance became effective may remain until a request is made to change the working or physical structure of the sign.

It is possible that Beebe is covered by the city's decision

the ordinance would not be retroactive for permanent signs. An investigation is being made now to determine the permanency of the sign and how long it's been on the site.

IN OTHER action Monday night, the council denied a request from Leonore Romney's campaign headquarters to operate a sound truck in the city on July 31, Aug. 1, 3, 4.

The council appointed City Manager John Dinan as delegate to the Michigan Municipal League's annual business meeting. Mayor Wilbur Brotherton is alternate.

The council also established 7 p.m. Aug. 3 as meeting time to discuss parking policy for the southeast quadrant of the downtown Farmington center.

Attending will be past councilmen and members of the downtown parking committee.

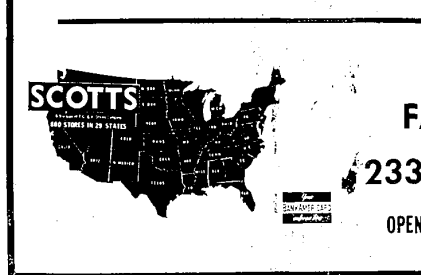

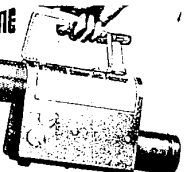

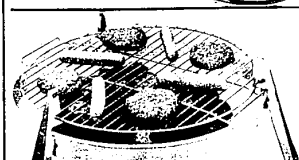
