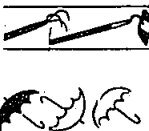
Merit scholars are named

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING
September 24, 1984

Mayor Williams opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on September 24, 1984 at 7:30 P.M. Members present: Alkatash, Dolan, Dodley, Williams and Wolf. Absent: Andriov and Soronen. Others present: City Manager Ostlick, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Poolman.

Minutes of September 18 were approved as amended.

Council enacted Zoning Map Amendment No. C-23-341, Zoning Request 34-6-84, to rezone Parts of lots 1 and 4 of Kensington Gardens Subdivision from RA-3 to RC-1. Council enacted Zoning Map Amendment No. C-23-343, Zoning Request PC 34-8-83, to rezone part of lot 186 of Wadwell, Wilson Rural Co. Kensington Park in Section 28 from B-1 to P-1.

Resolution was adopted approving Project Plan (Michigan Job Development Authority) for Wellington North, located on Northwestern Highway at Wellington Road. Project: Northwestern Enterprises Limited Partnership. Request for 18 Month Resort Class C license with Dance Permit located at 92205 Grand River for Paul Capraro was deleted from the agenda.

Discussion was held regarding property at 9 Mile and E-378 with a proposed amendment to a Consent Judgment.

Request of J.P.G. Inc. for an Entertainment Permit to be held in conjunction with 1984 Class C license with Dance Permit at 27811 Middlebelt Road was referred to staff for further information on parking.

Appointment for Zoning Board of Appeals was referred to staff for more information concerning the length of term of ZBA alternates.

Paul Sorovsky was appointed to the Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Commission.

Resolution was adopted granting a variance for construction in the floodway of Minnow Pond Road, Section 18 on Orchard Ridge Oaks Complex.

Council agreed not to initiate paving in Meadowbrook Heights Subdivision due to lack of interest.

Resolution was adopted to lease purchase order for riding tee and fringes mower equipment for Department of Special Services.

Council adopted a Resolution waiving sealed bids for the purchase of mobile communication equipment for Police and Fire Departments.

Council adopted Resolution approving Agreements for Right-of-Way acquisition work for Twelve Mile Road widening with Oakland County Road Commission and Michigan Department of Transportation.

Council adopted a Resolution issuing a purchase order for procurement of street sweeping services.

Discussion was held regarding Bridge Hills Open Space improvements in Section 28. Farmington Hills now has one Class C liquor license available and this matter will appear on an October agenda for City Council.
