Displaced homemaker program continues

Through a grant from Michigan Department of Labor, Office of Women and Work, Jewish Vocational Service and Community Workshop, a non-sectarian agency, announces the fourth year of a Displaced Homemaker Program for individuals from Wayne and Oakland counties.

Displaced homemakers are women who through divorce, separation, widowhood, or disability of spouse, have lost their source of economic support. After spending a substantial number of years in the home caring for family members, displaced homemakers find returning to the job market a

difficult transition.

The program offers vocational assessment, vocational counseling, job seeking skills and job placement assistance. Women who need to become financially self-sufficient, who need help in entering the job market after many years in the home, are invited to apply to Jewish Vocational Service.

Eligibility is based on marital and employment status. There are no income guidelines.
