To belp pay for the estimated \$2-mil-lion project, the city was awarded a matching grant through the Federal Aid to Urban Systems (FAUS). The fed-eral government will pay for 75 per-cent of the construction costs. Under the federal highway grant

While 12 Mile is under the county's jurisdiction, the federal money is the only way the thoroughfare will be widened to accommodate increased traffic. Farmington Hills consequently will be picking up the county's half of the remaining 25 percent cost of the

project, Costick said.

The city's share for the widening project will come to an estimated \$500,000. Council members last year set aside the city's share in the capital improvement fund.

Southfield's portion of 12 Mile, from Telegraph to Northwestern Highway is also to be widened under the same federal matching grant program. Costick
