Farmington takes city championship

Farmington golfers swept the first five places Friday to capture the annu-al Farmington Hill/City boys golf tour-nament at San Marino. The last time the Falcons had won a championship was 1982.

Paced by medalist Mark Balley, Parmington dethroned North Farmington as champion with a total of 401 strokes. North was a distant second with 431 and Farmington Harrison finished third with 454.

It was the sixth meet in which Balley selzed medalist honors. The senior led all competitors with a 5-over 77. Right behind were teammates Tom Wallag (79), Gordy Wright and Bob-Curtis (1) and Dave Casaroll (83).

"The weather started out nice, but became cold and cloudy," said Farm-ington coach Gene Schoeneich, now in his 22nd year. "The course played

damp, wet and a little slow, but he greens were holding."
