

North stops Eagle win streak

"Down this season. Lost too much to graduation and Laina Shaw moved out of the state. They're gonna struggle."

That was the pre-season word on the North Farmington girls basketball team this season. But, coach Greg Grodzicki has his Raiders playing inspired, and winning, basketball.

The Raiders put on a defensive clinic Thursday night in knocking off an improved Redford Thurston team, 39-16. The win was North's second straight in the Northwest Suburban League and its sixth in seven tries.

It also snapped Thurston's four-game winning streak.

"We played a man-to-man defense the whole game," said Grodzicki. "We didn't have to use our press."

The Raiders held Thurston scoreless in the second quarter, and thus built up a 24-4 lead by halftime.

"We held them to just one shot in the second quarter," Grodzicki said. "We had control of the game from beginning to end."

Give senior Isaly Butters credit as defensive star of the game. She held Thurston's top gun, Mary Kress, to just two points. Butters also scored six points and grabbed eight rebounds.

Sandy Spain had nine rebounds to go with her six points. Sue Shiffra scored six also. Lisa Mummert added six assists.

"We're looking like a basketball team now," he said. "We're moving the ball well, playing good defense — doing things we haven't done before."

An 18-8 second-quarter surge put Farmington comfortably ahead by halftime. In the third quarter, the Falcon defense limited Walled Lake Central to just two points.

Farmington guarder Alyse Fortune seemed to be on her way to a big night. She scored seven points in the first quarter, but got into foul trouble.

In stepped Mary Kay Orrico, who has been playing outstanding basketball of late. Orrico wound up scoring 10 points. Fortune finished with 11.

The win improves Farmington's record to 3-4.

Raddatz won the 200 freestyle in 2:11.43 and the 100 free in 59.73.

Joy won the 200 individual medley (2:26.51) and the 500 free (5:41.60).

Farmington got a strong performance from All-Area diver Katie MacIntosh. MacIntosh amassed 217.45 points, her best effort of the season.

Besty Brown (1:16.41 in the 100 backstroke), Carolyn Smith (1:13.16 in the 100 butterfly) and Julie Rainford (1:22.08 in the 100 breaststroke) were the other winners for Farmington.

Other Hawk winners were Catherine Tucker, 27.73 in the 50 free, and the 400

freestyle relay — Tara Loperena, Holly Ports, Raddatz and Nancy Schwedt

combined on the win. Farmington is now 1-2.

Farmington takes city championship
