Officials probe cause of blaze

The cause of a fire last week which resulted in an estimated \$75,000 in damage to the Bond Street building in Farmington Hills is still undetermined. Freelighters were called to a fire in the renovated Bond School, now called Bond Street, near 13 Mile and Orchard Lake roads, just before 10 p.m. Sept. 25, said Lt. Richard Marinucci.

Fire broke out in two rooms of the building's second floor, he said. Although most of the damage was contained within the two rooms, smoke damage spread throughout the second floor, Marinucci said.

ALTHOUGH THE two rooms on the

second floor were unoccupied at the time of the fire, tenants were expected to move in last weekend, said Ronald Hughes of Abbey Associates, the build-ing sowners.

Custodians who were cleaning the building that night reported the fire when they smelled smoke, Marinucci said. The offices on the second floor did not contain furniture and the utilities also were not yet turned on, he said.

"So we have no apparent accidental cause," Marinucci said. "He (the de-partment's fire inspector) has not ruled out the possibility that it was set."

Bond School was built in 1926. Unoc-cupied for about nine years, the school was renovated last year by Abbey As-sociates. The developers moved into the building last December.






