## County eyes transit study

Oakland County officials are hoping to get federal money to look into private transportation where public buses don't run.

"We certainly are optimistic about it," said Jean Willoughby, county director of federal and state aid. "Meanwhile, we're just waiting for word."

DESPITE OPPOSITION from Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA), the county applied for a 188,500 grant to study feasibility of a privately operated public transportation service. Oakland County would match the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) grant with 337,700.

The study would look at existing public transpor-tation services as well as areas SEMTA isn't serv-

ing.

"This task is expected to yield an understanding of the unmet transportation needs of the Oakland County riding public," says the work plan.
