A similar telecommunications program soon will be starting at Novi High School with MetroVision also providing the equipment.

Freedman emphasized that the telecommunications program will serve all three public high schools in

the Farmington area, although it'll be centered in Room E8 at North Farmington.

"North Farmington will be the center of operations, but a lot of the equipment is portable and will flow to Harrison and Farmington," he said.

Modifications planned for Room E8 include the installation of a director's booth where there is now a small stage.

"It is unbelievable, the lack of understanding which exists between each other."

He urged business persons to assess what is happening in the schools and to make an investment in education.
