How proposals fared

Farmington and Farmington Hills followed the state lead in its votes on the state proposals. The blitterly contested Proposal C to limit state and local taxing initiatives of government, went down to defeat in both Farmington and Farmington Hills, although more narrowly than on the state level.

In Farmington Hills, home of tax-cut advocate Richard Headlee, Proposal C failed by a slight margin — 14,347 in support to 14,771 in opposition. In the city of Farmington the proposal lost 2,933 to 2,599.

Proposal B, a proposed state amendment which had a direct impact on Farmington Hills' efforts to acquire a park, was successful. The amendment will forbid the state Legislature from dipping into the natural resources trust

fund and using the money for other

fund and using the money for other uses.

Farmington Hills has requested money from that fund to help acquire the 200-plus acres of land on 11 Mile and Farmington Road to use as elty park. But because of fund shortages, Farmington Hills, along with dozens of other communities have had to stand in line for money.

Farmington Hills supported the amendment, 17,386 to 9,741, in the city of Farmington the amendment passed, 3,298 to 1,939.

Proposition A, a proposal to allow the legislature to approve or disapprove administrative rules, failed in both municipalities, as well as statewide.

IN THE RACE for a U.S. Senate seat, the Farmington area was true to its Republican leanings while bucking the state trend which re-elected Detroit Democrat Carl Levin and sent challanger Jack Lousma down to defeat. In Farmington, Lousma, a former astronaut who returned to Michigan this year after a long absence to enter politics, defeated Levin, 3705 vytes to 2,305. The Hills went for Lousma,

17,093 votes to 12,528.

But in the state wide race — the one that counted — Levin carned a second term in Washington, defeating Lousma by a wide margin.

by a wide margin.

In the 18th Congressional District, which meanders through southern and eastern Oakland County, Incumbent William S. Broomfield — the longest-serving Republican in the U.S. House—easily won re-election to his 16th term, thumping Democrat Vivian Smargon and Libertarian Timothy O'Brich.

Valet totals from Oakland County

Vote totals from Oakland County (the 18th includes parts of Macomb and Livingston counties) showed that the 62-year-old Broomfield gathered 160,726 votes to Smargon's 38,578.

In Macomb County, Broomfield received 175,710 votes to Smargon's 43,595. Livingston County totals were unavailable.

Farmington Hills favored Broomfield (22,349 votes) over Smargon (6,194) and O'Brien (432). In Farmington, the Broomfield gathered 4,473 votes to Smargen's 1,043.
