## Tauber re-elected federation chief

Southfield business executive Joel D. Tauber was re-elected president of the Jewish Welfare Federation of Detroit at its 56th annual meeting at Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington Hills.

The federation, which was established in 1928, is the Jewish community's primary organization for Jewish philanthropy, budgeting and planning.

Formerly a vice president of Federation, Tauber was general chairman of the 1982 and 1983 Allied Jewish Campaigns. He is on the boards of United Jewish Charities, the Jewish Community Center — where he served as president — and the Detroit Service Group. He has been treasurer of the Jewish Family Service and is a trustee of Sinai Hospital.

Tauber was president of Federation's Young Adult Division in 1962 and received its Frank A. Wettsman Memorial Leadership Award in 1970.

A former regional chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, Tauber has been a member of its Young Leadership Cabinet and served as YLC national vice chairman.

Tauber is an alumnus of the University of Michigan, where he earned his law degree and bachelor's and master degrees in business administration. He is the president of Key International Manufacturing Inc. in Southfield.

Also re-elected at the annual meeting were Ruth Broder, Dr. Conrad Giles, Thomas I. Klein, David K. Page and Jack A. Robinson, vice presidents; and Wayne L. Feinstein, secretary. Mark E. Schluskel was elected treasurer.
