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Foundation donates money to school

Detroit Country Day School has received a check for \$565,800 as an 87-percent partial distribution of a gift from the William R. Angell Foundation. These funds, the largest single gift in Country Day's 70-year history, will be used to commence a general endowment fund for the school.

The Angell Foundation gift was obtained by Clifford H. Higgins Sr., a longtime trustee on the Detroit Country Day Board. Higgins has served for many years on the Board of Trustees of the William R. Angell Foundation.

Higgins, a Farmington resident and Chairman of the Board of H & H Tube and Manufacturing Co., served as Detroit Country Day's first chairman following the resignation of F. Alden Shaw, the founder and longtime headmaster of the school, in 1969.

Accepting the Angell Foundation check on behalf of the Country Day Board of Trustees were Anthony C. Bucasser, present board chairman, and Richard A. Schlegel, president-headmaster of the school.

"Cliff Higgins is one of the most loyal and dedicated friends that the school

has ever had. He has worked untiringly on behalf of Detroit Country Day School on each of our capital campaigns since the school moved to its present Birmingham location from Detroit in 1957.

"For many years, as a trustee and now president of the William R. Angell Foundation, he has worked to assure that our school would participate in the distribution of this gift which we now receive due to his perseverance and loyalty to the school he loves so well," said Schlegel.

The Higgins family have been supporters of Detroit Country Day School since the early 1950s, when the oldest son, Clifford H. Higgins Jr., started in the fifth grade. He graduated from Detroit Country Day School in 1959 and is now the president and chief executive officer of H & H Tube.

Higgins' youngest son, Larry R. Higgins, entered Detroit Country Day School in kindergarten and graduated in the class of 1971. He is vice president in charge of operations of H & H Tube.

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
