Apartment complex planned

The apartment market is booming in West Bloomfield.

Last week, the West Bloomfield Planning Commission approved site plans for 830 future rental units and set a Jan. 8 public hearing for a possible zoning change that would allow another 110.

Several other apartment complexes are already built or being built.

Why the sudden demand?

"It's a matter of interest rates suddenly dropping, the demand being

there for apartments, and the condominium market getting soft," township planning director Thomas Bird said.

Meanwhile, unhappy tenants in West Bloomfield's Aldingbrook Apartments on Drake Road are joining other nearby community protesters against rent increases. Bextak Corp. is being accused of taking advantage of the growing demand for apartments by raising rents.

"There's so much money floating around that people (developers) want to depreciate," Bird said. "The investment in apartments is attractive now. But it remains to be seen how much of what's

approved gets built.

The first guy to get the shovel in may absorb that market. It's a trend worth watching because we're consuming land already zoned for multiples. It is adding more balance to the township's housing stock."

The township master plan is being developed as it was intended, the planning director said. "I feel no great onus to respond to the speculative market. Let's see what shakes out of this batch."

AT LAST WEEK'S meeting, the commission:

- Approved Maple Village apartments site plan for 395 units on 33 1/2 acres on Maple Road, west of Farmington Road.

The apartments have two bedrooms in two-story buildings with an attached garage for each unit. Tennis courts, a clubhouse and manager's apartment are among the amenities. The architect is Leonard Siegal.

- Approved an unnamed 435-unit apartment complex petitioned for by James Schlesinger on 53 acres at Hagerty and Maple roads.

The southern portion to be developed first zoned for up to 12 units per acre.

Nursing home to appeal fine

THE PATIENT'S clinical record failed to document that nursing home staff responded to the emergency alarm system, according to health department officials.

The complaint said there was no evidence that the nursing home staff followed a physician's order for the use of physical restraints for the patient's safety, both in bed and when sitting in a chair.

It took another patient in a wheelchair 15 minutes to find a staff person to help the fallen patient, Bradshaw said.

The patient's wheelchair was found on a landing below the one where she was found, Bradshaw said. The patient sustained a few facial injuries as well as an injured shoulder, she continued.

At the time of the state's investigation, the patient was not restrained in bed as ordered by her physician, Bradshaw said.

A similar fine has been levied against the Ambassador Convalescent on Woodward in Detroit, according to health department officials.

Phelps said the department issues "two or three" fines a month.

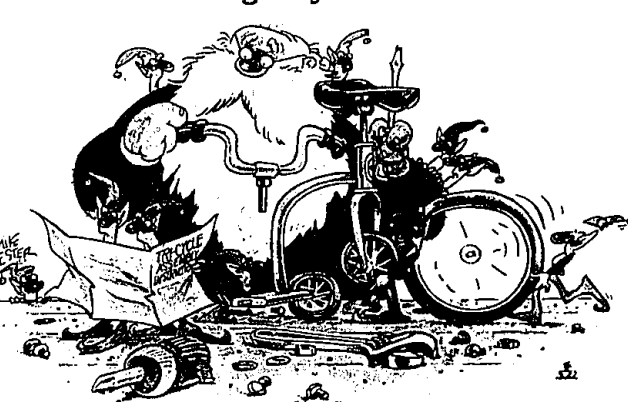
