Testimony ends in deprogramming trial

Two women, who said they were kidapped during a "deprogramming" attempt, weren't held against their will because they had no free will to exercise according to the testimony of
one of the eight defendants on trial in
Oakland County Circuit Court.

team of three deprogrammers and five

Six days of testimony by witnesses
from both sides ended Tuesday, when
the three deprogrammers and one of
the five security guards testified as

witnesses. Closing arguments are ex-pected to be made today before the jury is asked to decide on two counts of kidnapping for each defendant.

CHARGES STEM from an Incident two years ago when the staters were held Dec. 27-31 in Karen and Robert Larson's previously rented home at 5555 Shadow Lane in Bloomfield Township.

Elizabeth and Waltney were rescued late New Year's Eve when Bloomfield Township police and the FBI, acting on a tip from the sister's faither, Anthony Chase of Washington, D.C., broke down the door of the house. Elizabeth was 18 and Whitney 21 at the time.

Although testimony showed the Larsons contacted, hired and pald Brandy-berry to bring in the deprogrammers and guards, the Oakland County Prosecutor's office did not prosecute the Larsons.

Brandyberry said he has conducted

about 200 deprogrammings across the United States, Canada and Europe since 1979. THE SOFT-SPOKEN, heavy-set man told jurors how be had spent about 114 years as a member of the Rev. Sung Myung Moor's Unlifeation Church. Eventually, Brandyberry rose to the position of state leader in Utah and Ha-wali, which required a once-a-month flight to Moor's home, he said.

He also said he had been in two other culti-like groups, a transcendental meditation organization and a mind-development group. Each time, Brandy-berry said, mind control techniques were used. Under cross examination Brandyberry said he left each of those groups without being deprogrammed. Although he said he is unhappy if those people he deprograms return to their religious cults, Brandyberry said his goal is only to deliver information about the mind-controlling techniques. The deprogrammers do not try to change a person's religious beliefs,

WHEN QUESTIONED by defense attorney Larry Fugate, Brandyberry testified that he is still involved in doing deprogrammings. "Because I believe morally what I'm doing is right," he said. "Money is not a big factor. I have to live, pay the bills and buy equipment."

Brandyberry said he told Karen Larson and Bloomifeld Township police about the legal consequences of holding the sisters. But he tertified that he was aware of only the civil charges that might be brought against him not the criminal charge (tidnapping).

I felt, at the time, the litegal part would come if the girls went back and decided to bring charges civily." Brandyberry said, Earlier, he had said, "The only time I've ever had any hind of legal repercussions have been init suits where there have been suits against me and the family for large sums of money."

night, Murray said she thought it was cultists breaking in, so she ran into Whitney's room and locked the door, "I was afraid that the group had come into the house and I was afraid of harm," Murray said.

Defendant Rodney Bales and his wife, Rathy Ganno, both testiffed that they were once members of a mind-controlling Bible-based cult. Both were deprogrammed by Bob Brandyberry.

Under cross examination, Bales said he was aware the Chase sisters were there against their wishes, but never heard them sak or saw them try to leave. This incident was his first time as a deprogrammer, he said.

The third deprogrammer, Cheryl Johnson Breisland, also took the witness stand Tuesday. Breisland said she worked about 20 deprogrammings and is working on a master's degree in educational counseling.
