put yourself in a position where you may feel that reciprocity is necessary. When a business associate does send a small gift to your home, it is correct to write a thank you note and certainly mention it again the next time you see the giver.

A gift to the family should be acknowledged by both you and your spouse, he says.

If you send Christmas cards, mall them to the homes and not the office whenever possible. You may sign your


name alone to your eard or you may wish to send the greeting from you and your spouse. To use "Mr. and Mrs." on a Christmas card is too formal.

Use first names with the wife's name coming first, such as — Jane and John Smith. Don't send cards picturing your family and pels to business associates. Save them for close friends and family, Sherwood advises.

It is accepted practice, he says, to give your secretary a gift at Christmas but don't expect one in return.




