# Working in the mud a way of life

James, laying a mud-caked finger an inch or so into the freshly dug trench where the earth seemed to harden to the consistency of chocolate ice cream. That keeps everything up.

BOTH MEN were dressed for the job. James wore a heavy plad shirt and oversited yellow rubber boots. Vagnetti wore an old army field jacket, blue jeans and work shoes. His brogans, of course, were covered with mud. "This time of year, it's like this anyplace," James said. "It it's real bad. You walt until it freezes or dries up."

The sandy soil of the area provides "the best working canditions you can get," James said. "It's the best for dig-

"We were pouring a job at 12 and

James then used a surveyor's transit to "shoot grade" — make sure the ground is level before the concrete is poured. Vagnetti hopped into his huge cement mixer truck and managed to silp-silde it close to the trench so that his "ready mix" (a mixture of sand, cement and water) could be poured
