Missouri Synod Lutherans Reelect State President

The Rev. Richard L. Schlecht, pastor of St. John Lutheran Church, Rochester, N. Y., and president of the Michigan district of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, has been reelected to his first full term. He won his first ballot victory over four other candidates in the biennial convention in Ann Arbor July 27.

Rev. Schlecht was chosen from a list of candidates which included former District president, the Rev. Dr. W. Harry Krieger, the Revs. Edward A. Wescott Jr. and Edward Hessler, vice-presidents, and the Rev. Paul Heinicke, executive secretary of missions.

He inherited the office in July 1969, when the Rev. Dr. Edwin C. Weber, then president, was elected to the vice-presidency of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.
