Reye syndrome is a rare heye syndrome is a rare but dargerous condition that can develop from flu or chicken pox. It occurs mainly in children under 16, usually when they appear to be recovering. Watch for these signs:

■ Persistent vomiting ■ Fersistent vom: ■ Fatigue ■ Confusion and belligerence.

If your child displays any of these symptoms, consuit a doctor immediately.

Some studies indicate that there may be an association between the use of sprint for flu and chicken pox and the development of Reye syndrome. Further studies are being conducted on this possibility. In the meantime, the U.S. Surgeon General suggests that you check with your doctor before using aspirin or any medication when your child has flu or chicken pox.
