Wayne County Clerk-Register Merger Sought

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is seeking a state attorney general's opinion on whether it can merge the offices of county clerk and register of deeds during their present terms of office.

The commissioners, meanwhile, have asked Circuit Court not to appoint anyone to the vacancy created by the recent death of County Clerk Edgar M. Branigan pending issuance of the attorney general's ruling.

The county board acted at its Aug. 6 meeting.

The Board of commissioners earlier declared its intention to merge the two offices when the present terms expire at the end of 1972.

two offices could not be merged during their terms. However, the board of commissioners decided to seek a new ruling because the new state constitution has been adopted since then.

Merger of the two offices is contemplated as a step toward streamlining the county structure and promoting efficiency. State law empowers the 27-member Circuit Court bench to fill the clerk's vacancy.

2 Colleges Get Labor Mediators

Both Observerland community colleges are currently embroiled in faculty negotiations that have required the assistance of state labor mediators.

Mediator Leo Cadwell is assisting with bargaining between Oakland Community College and the OCC Faculty Association. Mediator Harry W. Reinfelder is assigned to the Schoolcraft Community College talks with the SC Faculty Forum.

Schoolcraft negotiators are eyeing an Aug. 24 deadline, the date classes are slated to begin. Instructors, by an informal vote last spring, have indicated they are unanimously against returning without a signed contract.

The OCC talks have a little more leeway, with classes not beginning until Sept. 8, but the Faculty Association announced this week it has formed a strike committee.

SUMMER-LONG REPORTS emanating from the closed-door sessions at both schools have the faculty teams accusing administrators of failure to bargain in good faith and the administrators denying it.

The OCC faculty once appealed to the courts for injunction relief of alleged administration stalling, but dropped the charge when the administration agreed to grant summer school instructors retroactive benefits.

At Schoolcraft, major disputes have been over an administration proposal to replace faculty members serving as area chairmen with six new administrators to be called division chairmen at the head of each department; the complex item of salaries and benefits; and the academic freedom clause.

Neither side has announced the specifics of the wage-benefits standoff.

SCHOOLCRAFT's chief bargainer, W. Kenneth Lindner, vice president for business, said mediator Reinfelder said the call for a mediator was premature after reviewing progress on Monday, Aug. 3.

He indicated that in his opinion no impasse has been reached. He suggested the teams continue to meet without benefit of mediation to resolve as many items as possible, and to bring to the table a number of topics which have not been discussed at all to date," said Lindner.

Reinfelder said he would return Tuesday, Aug. 11. Negotiations were to continue between principals daily, meanwhile.

"lack of progress in negotiations," and said: "The administration is not prepared to bargain and has wasted negotiation sessions by coming unprepared."

Tom Trudell, a member of the negotiating team, added, "We get rumors of counter-proposals and board positions, but no written formal offers. We will not continue to work indefinitely on rumors and verbal assurances."

In the association newsletter, which has been headed by negotiation reports to members since last spring, Trudell said the talks are "stalemated" and that "the administration seems either unable or unwilling to give equity to the faculty."

He cited an administration salary offer of \$9,300, which he said is "our current salary," and compared OCC instructor loads of 1,200 student credit
