Children's video prints available

Almost 2-million children are reported missing in the U.S. every year. Their photographs appear on bulletin boards across the country. Chances of finding and identifying a child can now be improved with a "videoprint," a live video recording of a child.

"A videoprint is like a fingerprint, except that all the aspects of the child including his or her speech can be captured and kept on record," said Bob Burnett of 3M, which manufactures Scotch-brand videocassettes.

Together with Paramount Home Vi-

deo and duplicator Bell & Howell/Columbia Pictures Video Division, 3M is supporting a program to educate children and parents about child abuse and abduction.

"Every child has his or her own special characteristics - a video recording can bring them out much better than a still photo," Burnett added. "A characteristic of behavior, for example, may trigger recognition."

A video recording can be kept as a permanent record in the home or filed with a local social service organization and updated every year. If it is ever necessary, the videoprint can be sent to television stations for broadcasting.

The three companies are actively promoting the new Paramount Home Video videocassette "Strong Kids, Safe Kids." Featuring Henry Winkler as The Fonz, the character he created on "Happy Days" the videocassette educates children about molestation.

Fourteen minutes of the videocassette, which has a suggested retail price of \$29.95, have been left blank for parents to make a video recording of their child. Instructions for "videoprinting" also appears on the videocassette.

In addition, the companies are producing a special blank "Strong Kids, Safe Kids Videoprinting Videocassette" on a not-for-profit basis. The videoprinting cassette, which uses Scotch videotape, can be bought separately.

Application sought for science summer

Applications are now being accepted for Lawrence Institute of Technology's Seventeenth Annual Summer Science Institute (SSI) scheduled for June 17 through July 26, 1985.

The six week program is open to current high school juniors who are interested in science, computer science, mathematics, or engineering, have maintained at least a "B" average, and have received no grades lower than a "B" in math and science. Applicants should have completed one year of both chemistry and geometry and two years of algebra by the end of the 1984-85 academic year. LIT's program is limited to 60 students who have demonstrated superior achievement and who have been recommended by their counselor or principal and science or math teacher.

PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE tuition free instruction by full-time faculty members of LIT's School of Arts and Science in topics ranging from chemical kinetics to computer techniques on LIT's campus in Southfield. In addition to classroom instruction, participants will use the college's digital computer, visit research laboratories, and attend lectures by some of the nation's leading corporation executives, researchers, and engineers who are brought to LIT to meet with students.

The program is funded each year by LIT and grants from local corporations and foundations. The only cost to the student is a \$60 non-refundable registration fee. All materials will be furnished.

Applications must be postmarked by April 26. Admitted applicants will be notified by May 10 and must accept by May 20. For applications or further information students should contact their
