Almost 2-million children are reported missing in the U.S. every year. Their photographs appear on bulletin boards across the country. Chances of finding and identifying a child can now be improved with a "videoprint," a live video recording of a child.

"A videoprint is like a fingerprint, including all the aspects of the child including his or her speech can be captured and kept on record," said Bob Burnett of 3M, which manufactures Scotch-brand videocassettes.

Together with Paramount Home Vi-

deo and duplicator Bell & Howell/Columbia Pictures Video Division, 3M is supporting a program to educate children and parents about child abuse and abduction.

"Every child has his or her own special characteristics — a video recording can bring them out much better than a still photo," Burnett added. "A characteristic of behavior, for example, may trigger recognition."

A video recording can be kept as a permanent record in your home or filed with a local social service organization and updated every year. If ever necessary, the videoprint can be sent to television stations for broadcasting.
