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development because of the lack of sewers.

Gaul noted the firm is eager to begin development and submitted for approval a plan for homes to be served by the 13 mile sewer arm.

"We've never had a piece of land like this has this," Gaul commented.

Although Gaul wanted approval of 160 acres of single

family residences, most of the discussion centered on the entire project.

The determining factor in developing the whole parcel is sewer service, Gaul said, and now that an unnamed firm is negotiating to finance the 10 mile sewer arm, a more complete development might be possible.

THE PULTE representative said figures on the costs of the

10 mile sewer arm are being checked so that the firm, whose interest in the project lies in an office development in

Quakertown, Penn., is not making no commitment. Township officials announced Monday night that a New York firm was interested in financing the sewer so it could continue efforts to build a major office complex in Quakertown.

Stader asked Township Attorney Joseph T. Brennan the status of the 10 mile sewer, and Brennan replied that he was asked to draw up a resolution looking favorably on the plans but making no commitment.

Brennan noted Quakertown is astride the route of the 10 mile sewer arm and that no great clamor for the service has been heard.

"I don't think anybody has

written any signatures on any checks yet," the township attorney commented.
