Chrysler sets up body to improve its technology

Chrysler Corp. has established a Technology Advisory Council to help the automaker improve its technology, Chrysler chairman Lee Iacocca said.

The council consists of nationally recognized leaders from the industrial and academic communities, Iacocca said.

"This outstanding group of scientists and engineers has the expertise and perspective to provide Chrysler with independent sources of technological advice and awareness," Iacocca said.

"The council will be a creative force in helping the company use new technology effectively. It should also challenge us to develop new ways of doing business in an effort to bring about technological breakthroughs."

Iacocca will chair the council, and Jack D. Withrow, Chrysler's executive vice president of product development, will be the corporation's liaison officer with the group.
