Hummel figures are made during the second annual limited visit of this exhibit in the United States.

Wash Goebel craftsman create outside M. I. Hummel figures. Three related artists direct from the Goebel factory in West Germany will mold, assemble, and paint the figures before you very eyes.

This 1000 sq. ft. factory exhibit will be open for viewing from 10-11:30 a.m., 2-4, and 6-8:30 p.m. on April 18 and 19, and from 10-11:30 a.m. and 2-4 p.m. on April 20.

Artists will sign Goebel collectibles purchased at Bronner's on April 18-20 for 20 minutes following each factory session noted above.

The Goebel-Beile, Promotion Co-ordinator of the Goebel Collectors Club in Tarrytown, New York, will also be at Bronner's to meet with visitors during the factory exhibit.

The world's foremost collectors and enthusiasts on M. I. Hummel figures, Robert and Ruth Miller, from Kalamazoo, will appear throughout the event during the time of the factory display. Mr. Miller is the author of "The M. I. Price Guide to M. I. Hummel."

1985 is the 50th anniversary of the production of M. I. Hummel figures. In honor of the golden anniversary, Goebel is producing a special figurine named "Jubilee." This figurine will not be produced beyond 1985.

Visitors may also view Bronner's M. I. Hummel collection (over 400 figurines) and a mold exhibit showing the 14 Hummel production steps, 8 p.m. to 9 p.m. on April 18-19, and from 8-9:30 p.m. on April 20. All events are free of charge.
