crowns, and her bouquet consisted of a white orchid, pom-pom chrysanthemums and stephanotis.

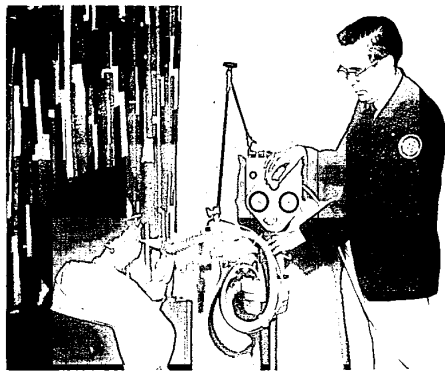

Lungs Get Special Care In New Hospital Center

A steady increase in chronic obstructive lung disease, blamed partly on environmental factors such as air pollution, is being countered with new treatments and sophisticated equipment.

To help rehabilitate patients with emphysema, chronic bronchitis, bronchial asthma and related diseases, Mount Carmel Mercy Hospital and Medical Center operates a complete respiratory care center.

Treatment can be given at a hospitalized patient's bedside, to outpatients, and through patient education and home care programs. Admission is through physician referral. Emergency service also is rendered, according to Dr. Willard S. Holt Jr., medical director of the center.

tie tests and an individual program for rehabilitation. Machines check pulmonary function, measure breathing capacity and exhalation, and analyze blood gas (oxygen and carbon dioxide), Dr. Holt explained.

Ultrasonic nebulizers are used to increase moisture within the respiratory tract. Intermittent positive-pressure breathing devices reduce the effort of breathing and deposit medication in a fine mist.

MEDICALLY APPROVED exercise equipment is available for patients needing to improve stamina and physical fitness within the limits of their disease.

An educational program in home care for the patient and his family teaches bronchial hygiene, use of oxygen therapy and breathing machines, breathing exercises, and general health maintenance.
