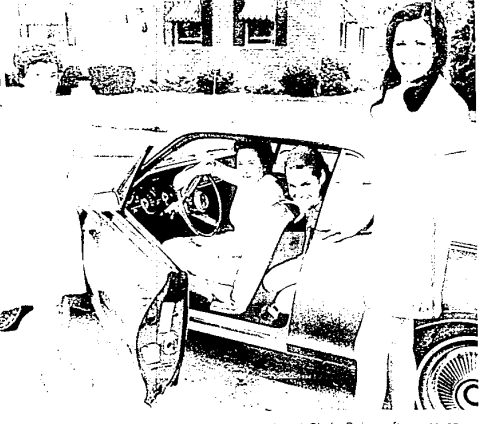

Chorale Is Fun, Work

What happens when a group of high school juniors and seniors suddenly find themselves in a foreign country surrounded by non-English speaking people, strange food and different customs? This has been the situation for 64 members of the 1970 Youth for Understanding Chorale since June 22, when they arrived in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, as the first stop on their seven-week tour of South America.

Among the group who arrived home last Friday were three from Observerland: Laura Upton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William R. Upton, of Plymouth, and Cindy Quinn, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Quinn and Debbie Swain, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Swain, both of Livonia.

ALL THREE came home talking about their new families and new brothers and sisters. During the stay in various South American cities, they lived with host families and became part of their family life. Their first and longest stay, four weeks, was in Rio de Janeiro, and according to Laura, it was a wonder the plane was able to get off the ground when they left. It was so swash with tears, "I had a wonderful family," she says, "and Rio has to be the most beautiful city in the world."

Most found that many of their host families have children who have been in the Youth for Understanding program and have gone to school in the United States. In Rio most of the Portuguese-speaking hosts have studied a little English and were delighted to have a guest who could not practice.
