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## 9 pianists to play Bach

As the musical world commemorates Bach's 260th birthday, Oakway Symphony will celebrate the event with nine pianos in a Bach Extravaganza at 3 p.m. Sunday at Harrison High School, 12 Mile and Middlebelt, Farmington Hills.

The program, conducted by Francesco DiBlasi, also will include "Pictures at an Exhibition" by Mussorgsky.

Tickets at \$4 for students and senior citizens and \$7 for general admission are available at Madonna College in Livonia, Hammill Music in Livonia and Plymouth, Executive Office Supply in Farmington and the Livonia Board of Education Offices.

Opening the concert will be Martha Welton performing the Brandenburg Concerto No. 3 in G major on the harpsichord. She will be followed by Alexander Hanway and Donald Morelock performing Bach's Concerto No. 3 in C minor for two pianos.

THE NUMBER of pianos on stage will increase as Sonia Geoffrey, Carole Lasser and Linda Wotring present Bach's Concerto No. 2 in C major for three pianos.

Final piano opus will be Bach's Concerto in A minor for four pianos. The pianists — Judy Deuterman, Eleanor Peets, Jan Smith and Yoshiko Ashima — are all members of the Farmington Musicians.

After intermission, the symphony's performance will continue with "Pictures at an Exhibition," which was inspired and is named after a memorial showing of sketches and drawings by Victor Alexandrovich Hartman, who was a close friend of the composer, Mussorgsky.

This Oakway performance will be presented in cooperation with the Farmington Musicians and the Livonia Piano Teacher's Forum.

Alexander Hanway holds a bachelor of music history and a master of music in piano from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. Donald Morelock coordinates the piano program at Schoolcraft College in Livonia and has studied in Vienna, Dallas, Aspen and New York City. He taught piano at the All-State Piano Program at Interlochen last summer.
