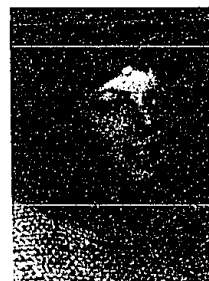


## Taylor-Weglarz

# 'Dance Fever' auditions open

# Boysville seeks foster parents

# Coping strategy is topic for all-day conference

Strategies for coping with loss is the subject of a conference sponsored by the Continuum Center of Oakland University from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Thursday, May 16, in Southfield Hilton. The keynote address, "Growing Through Life's Losses" will be given by Alexis Jay Stein, executive director, and Howard Robin Winkler, president of "To Life," a Charlotte, N.C.-based, non-

profit agency which provides program services for persons coping with grief and loss and offers other life enhancement opportunities.

Mary Lou Stone, conference coordinator, and coordinator of the Continuum Center's older adult project talks about the need for such a conference.

"This is our second conference on loss," she says. "We had more than 200 people last year, eager to learn how to deal with loss. Although the conference is designed with human service people

in mind, it is open to the public," says Stone.

"We're finding that so many people are extremely interested in this topic. If you look at the workshop topics for the conference, you begin to see just how many different kinds of losses we all experience. We are just beginning to learn what are the most helpful ways to come to terms with these various losses. Different people need different ways to cope. Some losses are much harder to deal with than others. Men,

women and children, all have very specific needs when it comes to facing loss."

Workshop topics include explaining death to a child, infertility, teen-age suicide, divorce, hospice care for the terminally ill, depression and loss, personal loss, and male and female bereavement.
