School board takes no action on Hills school site offers

The Clarenceville School Board last week reviewed two offers to purchase the Westbrook Elementary School property in Farmington Hills.

No action was taken to accept either offer while trustees told their attorneys to draft language so that both parties can benefit.

Ed Salisz, assistant director of business, said the trustees wanted the language to reflect that the board would make no improvements on the property in order to sell it. Both prospective buyers reportedly included such provisions in their offers.

"They (the trustees) want to sell it as is," Salisz said. "We don't want to put any money into it regardless of what the problems are."

In past weeks, the board received a \$50,000 offer to sell the land to a small group of investors who want to develop a nursery school-cultural center for American Moslems of Indian and Pakistani descent. Last week a second offer of \$50,000 arrived from a construction contractor who said he would reconstruct the former school building into small apartments.

The school site is located on five acres on Osmus Street, an unpaved road. The school has been boarded up and used for storage by the district since it was closed due to declining enrollment in June 1974.

According to Salisz, the contractor, Jeff L. White, whose family owns a wine store on Grand River, made his offer contingent on the district repairing Westbrook's roof. The other prospective buyer had made stipulations on the furnace being repaired.

The property is currently zoned for residential use.

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Area skaters will compete

Three area speed skaters have been invited to compete Saturday and Sunday, May 3-4, in the Outdoor Roller Speed Skating Nationals in Colorado Springs. They are Denise McLeod of Livonia, Lori O'Neill and Dawn Thomas of Farmington Hills.

In preparation for the event, to be held at the U.S. Olympic Training Center, the three women practice at least four hours a day. They skate indoors at Livonia's Silverdale Arena and outdoors at the Mal Kai Theatre, also in Livonia.

McLeod, a past national champion, is one of four women picked to skate on the 1984 U.S. roller speed skating team. Last August, she also earned a silver medal in the world road race skating competition in Columbia. In July, she will be representing the United States in the World Games in England.

O'Neill, a past regional and national

champion, will be competing in July in the National Sports Festival in Louisiana. She is participating in the team tryouts to be held this summer for the U.S. roller speed skating team.

Thomas, a regional champion and silver medalist in national competition, also will compete in the National Sports Festival. Like O'Neill, she has been invited to try for a place on the U.S. speed team.

All three are coached by Rob Dunn of Livonia. As an amateur skater, Dunn skated three years for the U.S. world team in Italy, Puerto Rico, New Zealand and Columbia. In Italy, he won silver medals in both the road race and track events.

A professional skater, Dunn now coaches the Riverside Striders Speed Team. McLeod, O'Neill and Thomas are all members of the team.
